How we aim to use the funding

At St. Joseph & St Bede we recognise the contribution of Physical Education to the health and well-being of our children. In addition, it is considered that an innovative and varied Physical Education curriculum and extra-curricular opportunities have a positive influence on the concentration, attitude and academic achievement of all children.

The governors agree that the money must be used so that all children benefit regardless of their sporting

ability and have agreed to spend the funding on:

- Specialist coaches in Physical Education
- Sports specific coaching sessions in gymnastics.
- Working in partnership with other primary schools to offer opportunities for able and talented children
- Provision of staff professional development through attending sessions led by highly qualified coaches
- Purchase of sports equipment subsequent to an audit
- Transportation to School Games competitions

We continue to place a high priority on our Physical Education provision and, as such, have invested in additional staffing/coaching and resources to further enhance the Physical Education curriculum and extra— curricular sports during lunchtime and after schools clubs.
